PROPOSITION 207

PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION RELATING TO THE RESPONSIBLE ADULT USE, REGULATION AND TAXATION OF MARIJUANA

OFFICIAL TITLE: AMENDING SECTION 36-2817, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 36, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING CHAPTER 28.2; AMENDING TITLE 42, CHAPTER 5, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING ARTICLE 10; AMENDING TITLE 43, CHAPTER 1, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 43-108; RELATING TO THE RESPONSIBLE ADULT USE, REGULATION AND TAXATION OF MARIJUANA.

DESCRIPTIVE TITLE: THE LAW WOULD ALLOW LIMITED MARIJUANA POSSESSION, USE, AND CULTIVATION BY ADULTS 21 OR OLDER; AMEND CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR MARIJUANA POSSESSION; BAN SMOKING MARIJUANA IN PUBLIC; IMPOSE A 16% EXCISE TAX ON MARIJUANA SALES TO FUND PUBLIC PROGRAMS; AUTHORIZE STATE/LOCAL REGULATION OF MARIJUANA LICENSEES; AND ALLOW EXPUNGEMENT OF MARIJUANA OFFENSES.

A "YES" vote shall have the effect of allowing adults 21 years or older to use, possess, or transfer up to one ounce of marijuana and cultivate for personal use not more than six marijuana plants at a primary residence; banning smoking marijuana in public places and open spaces; amending criminal classifications and penalties for marijuana possession and use; allowing the retail sale of marijuana at licensed establishments; imposing a 16% excise tax on marijuana sales to fund community colleges, infrastructure, public safety, and public health programs; authorizing state and local regulation of the sale and production of marijuana by a capped number of licensees; and allowing courts to vacate and expunge certain marijuana arrests, charges, adjudications, convictions, or sentences. A "NO" vote shall have the effect of retaining current law regarding the use of marijuana.

PROPOSITION 208

PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION RELATING TO EDUCATION FUNDING

OFFICIAL TITLE: AMENDING TITLE 15, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING CHAPTER 10.1; AMENDING SECTION 15-1655, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 43, CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 43-1013; RELATING TO EDUCATION FUNDING.

DESCRIPTIVE TITLE: THE LAW WOULD IMPOSE A 3.5% TAX SURCHARGE ON TAXABLE ANNUAL INCOME OVER \$250,000 FOR SINGLE PERSONS OR MARRIED PERSONS FILING SEPARATELY, OR \$500,000 FOR MARRIED PERSONS FILING JOINTLY OR HEADS OF HOUSEHOLDS, TO INCREASE FUNDING FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION.

A "YES" vote shall have the effect of imposing a 3.5% income tax surcharge, in addition to existing income tax rates, on taxable annual income over \$250,000 for single persons or married persons filing separately, or \$500,000 for married persons filing jointly or heads of households, to provide additional funds for public education; creating a new fund to direct the additional revenue to hiring and increasing salaries for teachers and other non-administrative support personnel, career training and higher education pathway programs for high school students, and the Arizona Teachers Academy; and increasing the dollar amount of scholarships available through the Arizona Teachers Academy.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION REFERRED BY THE COUNCIL PERTAINING TO CITY OF PEORIA'S NEW GENERAL PLAN ENTITLED "PLANPEORIAAZ 2040 GENERAL PLAN"

OFFICIAL TITLE: A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PEORIA, ARIZONA TO REPLACE THE CURRENT PEORIA GENERAL PLAN 2010 ADOPTED BY CITY COUNCIL AND RATIFIED BY VOTERS, INCLUDING ALL SUCCESSOR AMENDMENTS THERETO, WITH A NEW GENERAL PLAN KNOWN AS "PLANPEORIAAZ 2040 GENERAL PLAN" PURSUANT TO TITLE 9, CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE 6 OF THE ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; PLANPEORIAAZ 2040 GENERAL PLAN ESTABLISHES A COMPREHENSIVE, LONG-RANGE VISION OF PEORIA'S FUTURE DEVELOPMENT AND PRESERVATION; ADDRESSES ALL GEOGRAPHIC AREAS AND SPHERES OF INFLUENCE WITHIN THE CITY'S MUNICIPAL PLANNING AREA; AND FURTHER DIRECTS THAT THE PLANPEORIAAZ 2040 GENERAL PLAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS FOR RATIFICATION AT THE NEXT GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020.

DESCRIPTIVE TITLE: General Plans require voter approval every ten years. The General Plan was developed using a 12-month public engagement process. General Plans guide land use, transportation, public facilities, open space, growth and planning in the City. Voter approval would ratify the Peoria General Plan previously adopted by the City Council.

A "YES" vote shall have the effect of ratifying the PlanPeoriaAz 2040 General Plan which will be valid for a period of not to exceed ten years.

CLARKDALE-JEROME E.S.D. #3

Shall the Governing Board of Clarkdale-Jerome Elementary School District No. 3 of Yavapai County, Arizona, adopt a General Maintenance and Operation Budget which includes an amount that exceeds the revenue control limit specified by statute by 10% for fiscal year 2021/2022 and for six subsequent years as described below? The 2021/2022 budget override authority represents an increase of the current 10% budget override authority which is scheduled to expire after 2022/2023 if the voters do not approve this override.

The amount of the proposed budget increase of the proposed budget over the alternate budget for fiscal year 2021/2022 is estimated to be \$290,214. In fiscal years 2021/2022 through 2025/2026 the amount of the proposed increase will be ten percent of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes. In fiscal years 2026/2027 and 2027/2028, the amount of the proposed increase will be six and two-thirds percent and three and one-thirds percent, respectively, of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes.

Any budget increase authorized by this election shall be entirely funded by a levy of taxes on the taxable property within this school district for the year for which adopted and for six subsequent years, shall not be realized from monies furnished by the state and shall not be subject to the limitation on taxes specified in Article IX, Section 18, Constitution of Arizona. Based on the current net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes, to fund the proposed increase in the school district's budget would require an estimated tax rate of \$ 0.557 dollar per one hundred dollars of net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes and is in addition to the school district's tax rate that will be levied to fund the school district's revenue control limit allowed by law.

A "YES" vote shall authorize the Clarkdale-Jerome Elementary School District Governing Board to adopt a maintenance and operation budget which exceeds its revenue control limit by up to 10% per year for seven years commencing in 2021/2022.

A "NO" vote shall not authorize the Clarkdale-Jerome Elementary School District Governing Board to adopt a maintenance and operation budget which exceeds its revenue control limit by up to 10% per year for seven years commencing in 2021/2022.

PRESCOTT U.S.D. #1

Shall the Governing Board of Prescott Unified School District No. 1 of Yavapai County, Arizona (the "District"), adopt a General Maintenance and Operation Budget that includes an amount that exceeds the revenue control limit specified by statute by 8.00% for fiscal year 2021/2022 and for six subsequent years as described below? The fiscal year 2021/2022 budget override authority represents an extension and increase of the existing budget override authority which is scheduled to phase down by one-third for fiscal year 2021/2022, by another one-third for fiscal year 2022/2023, and terminate for fiscal year 2023/2024 if the voters do not approve the override.

The amount of the proposed budget increase of the proposed budget over the alternate budget for fiscal year 2021/2022 is estimated to be \$1,214,294. In fiscal years 2021/2022 through 2025/2026 the amount of the proposed increase will be 8.00% of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes. In fiscal years 2026/2027 and 2027/2028, the amount of the proposed increase will be 5.33% and 2.66%, respectively, of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes.

Any budget increase authorized by this election shall be entirely funded by a levy of taxes on the taxable property in this school district for the year for which adopted and for six (6) subsequent years, shall not be realized from monies furnished by the state and shall not be subject to the limitation on taxes specified in Article IX, Section 18, Constitution of Arizona. Based on the current net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes, to fund the proposed increase in the school district's budget would require an estimated tax rate of \$0.20 per one hundred dollars of net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes and is in addition to the school district's tax rate that will be levied to fund the school district's revenue control limit allowed by law.

A "YES" vote shall authorize the Prescott Unified School District Governing Board to extend and increase the existing maintenance and operation budget override authority and resulting tax.

BAGDAD U.S.D. #20

Shall the Governing Board of Bagdad Unified School District No. 20 of Yavapai County, Arizona (the "District"), adopt a General Maintenance and Operation Budget applicable to grades Kindergarten through Eight that includes an amount that exceeds the revenue control limit specified by statute by 15% for fiscal year 2021/2022 and for six subsequent years as described below? The fiscal year 2021/2022 budget override authority represents an extension of the existing budget override authority which is scheduled to phase down by one-third for fiscal year 2021/2022, by another one-third for fiscal year 2022/2023, and terminated for fiscal year 2023/2024 if the voters do not approve the override.

The amount of the proposed continuation of the budget increase of the proposed budget over the alternate budget for fiscal year 2021/2022 is estimated to be \$-0-. In fiscal years 2021/2022 through 2025/2026 the amount of the proposed increase will be 15% of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes. In fiscal years 2026/2027 and 2027/2028, the amount of the proposed increase will be 10% and 5%, respectively, of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes.

Any budget increase continuation authorized by this election shall be entirely funded by a levy of taxes on the taxable property in this school district for the year for which adopted and for six (6) subsequent years, shall not be realized from monies furnished by the state and shall not be subject to the limitation on taxes specified in Article IX, Section 18, Constitution of Arizona. Based on the current net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes, to fund the proposed continuation of the increase in the school district's budget would require an estimated continuation of a tax rate of \$0.30 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes and is in addition to the school district's tax rate that will be levied to fund the school district's revenue control limit allowed by law.

A "YES" vote shall authorize the Bagdad Unified School District Governing Board to continue the existing maintenance and operation budget applicable to grades K-8 override authority and resulting tax, which includes an amount that exceeds the District's revenue control limit.

A "NO" vote shall not authorize the Bagdad Unified School District Governing Board to continue the existing maintenance and operation budget applicable to grades K-8 override authority and resulting tax.

BAGDAD U.S.D. #20

Shall the Governing Board of Bagdad Unified School District No. 20 of Yavapai County, Arizona, adopt a General Maintenance and Operation Budget for grades 9-12 which includes an amount that exceeds the revenue control limit specified by statute as described below?

The budget for fiscal year 2020/2021 (the preceding fiscal year) is \$4,340,639; the amount of the proposed increase of the proposed budget over the alternate budget for fiscal year 2021/2022 is estimated to be \$-0-; and the amount the District would be allowed to budget for if the measure is not approved is \$4,514,265.

The budget override authorized by this Election allows the Bagdad Unified School District to levy property taxes in excess of the property tax levy allowed by law to fund the school district's revenue control limit. The property tax levy for the year for which adopted and for four subsequent years will be annually adjusted based on a formula that authorizes the Bagdad Unified School District to exceed the revenue control limit by up to sixty-five per cent for grades nine through twelve. The levy shall not be realized from monies furnished by the state and shall not be subject to the limitation on taxes specified in Article IX, Section 18, Constitution of Arizona. Based on an estimate of assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes, the proposed override in the Bagdad Unified School District's budget over that allowed by the revenue control limit would result in an estimated increase in the school district's tax rate of \$0.45 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes.

A "YES" vote shall authorize the Bagdad Unified School District Governing Board to adopt a maintenance and operation budget applicable to grades 9-12 which includes an amount that exceeds the District's revenue control limit by an estimated \$530,000 in the first year and such amount in years two through five as may be authorized by statute.

A "NO" vote shall not authorize the Bagdad Unified School District Governing Board to continue the 9-12 small school override.

Shall the Governing Board of Humboldt Unified School District No. 22 of Yavapai County, Arizona (the "School District"), adopt maintenance and operations budgets which allow the School District to exceed the revenue control limit specified by law in the amount of not more than five percent (5%) per fiscal year for fiscal year 2021/2022 and the next subsequent six (6) fiscal years thereafter?

The 2021/2022 proposed School District budget will exceed the alternate proposed School District budget by approximately \$1,773,945. The amount of the proposed increase will be based on a percentage of the School District's revenue control limit in future years as provided in Section 15-481(P), Arizona Revised Statutes. Any budget increase authorized by this election shall be entirely funded by a levy of taxes on the taxable property within this School District for the year for which adopted and for six subsequent years, shall not be realized from monies furnished by the state and shall not be subject to the limitation on taxes specified in article IX, section 18, Constitution of Arizona. Based on the current net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes, to fund the proposed increase in the School District's budget would require an estimated tax rate of \$0.36 per one hundred dollars of net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes and is in addition to the School District's tax rate that will be levied to fund the School District's revenue control limit allowed by law.

A "YES" vote shall authorize the Humboldt Unified School District Governing Board to adopt maintenance and operation budgets which include an amount which exceeds the District's revenue control limit by 5% with the resulting tax.

A "NO" vote shall not authorize the Humboldt Unified School District Governing Board to adopt maintenance and operation budgets which include an amount which exceeds the District's revenue control limit by 5% with the resulting tax.

State Route 69, Prescott Valley, Arizona 86314, or any portion thereof, and use all or a portion of any proceeds of such sale, lease/lease-purchase and/or exchange to (i) pay any outstanding bonded indebtedness, (ii) reduce taxes, (iii) pay maintenance and operation expenditures (with certain limitations) or capital outlay, or (iv) construct, improve and furnish school buildings?

A "YES" vote shall authorize the Humboldt Unified School District Governing Board to sell, lease, or exchange the real property described in the ballot.

QUESTION 3

HUMBOLDT U.S.D. #22

Shall Humboldt Unified School District No. 22 of Yavapai County, Arizona (the "School District"), be authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the School District in the form of class B general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$30,000,000 for the purpose of raising money for building or renovating school buildings, supplying school buildings with furniture, equipment and technology, improving school grounds, purchasing pupil transportation vehicles and providing for other general capital expenses or for liquidating any indebtedness already incurred for such purposes for paying all legal, financial, engineering, architectural, project management and administration and other necessary costs in connection therewith and, in connection therewith as necessary, to build school buildings, said bonds and any bonds issued to refund such bonds or other bonds of the School District to be sold for prices which may include premium in amounts permitted by applicable law and to be refundable by the issuance of refunding bonds of a weighted average maturity of less than 75% of the weighted average maturity of the bonds being refunded, to bear interest at a rate of not to exceed 12% per annum, payable semiannually on the first day of January and the first day of July of each year until the maturity of each bond and at the option of the School District to be evidenced by separate supplemental interest certificates, to mature over a period of not more than 20 years from the date of their issuance, to be in the amount of \$5,000 of principal amount each or multiples thereof and to mature on the first day of the same month of each year which may be either January or July?

The issuance of these bonds will result in a property tax increase sufficient to pay the annual debt service on bonds.

The capital improvements that are proposed to be funded through this bond issuance are to exceed the State standards and are in addition to monies provided by the State.

The School District is proposing to issue class B general obligation bonds totaling \$30,000,000 to fund capital improvements over and above those funded by the State. Under the Students FIRST Capital funding system, the School District is entitled to State monies for new construction and renovation of school buildings in accordance with State law.

A "YES" vote shall authorize the School District Governing Board to issue and sell \$30,000,000 of general obligation bonds of the School District to be repaid with secondary property taxes.

A "NO" vote shall not authorize the School District Governing Board to issue and sell such bonds of the School District.
