The Presidential Preference Election (PPE) is a "CLOSED PARTY ELECTION". Only voters registered with a participating party may vote in the PPE.

EARLY VOTING OPTIONS

VOTE EARLY. VOTE EASY.

AUTOMATIC BALLOT-BY-MAIL

Voters may request to receive their ballots automatically by mail approximately three weeks before any election in which they are eligible to vote. Sign up using servicearizona.com or call (928) 771-3248 ext. 9.

If you no longer wish to receive your ballot-by-mail or to cancel the mailing of early ballots for one or more elections, call our office at (928) 771-3248 ext 9.

REQUEST AN EARLY BALLOT Voters may

request an early ballot be mailed up to 11 days before an election. An early ballot can be requested on-line, by phone, or in writing.

VOTE EARLY IN-PERSON

All locations will be open the Friday before Election Day until 7PM.

WHERE TO VOTE

Vote Centers will be open from 6am-7pm for the PPE, Primary and General Elections.

If you do not receive an automatic Ballot-by-Mail, you will receive a sample ballot before each election that lists the conveniently located Vote Centers throughout Yavapai County. Visit www.yavapaivotes.gov for more information.

ALL REGISTERED VOTERS CAN VOTE IN THE PRIMARY...HERE'S HOW

THE PRIMARY ELECTION

All registered voters are eligible to vote in the July Primary Election.

voters who are registered with a recognized political party—Democratic, Green, Libertarian, No Labels, or Republican —may only vote with that party's ballot.

VOTERS WHO are NOT registered with a recognized political party, including those registered as Independent, may choose either Democratic or Republican. Libertarian, Green, and No Labels, are holding a closed Primary.

VOTERS WHO are on the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) and are not registered with a recognized political party must let the Recorder's Office know which party ballot (Democratic or Republican) they want to receive. You will receive a 90-Day Notice in the mail. Please return it with your selection in the envelope provided. If a party ballot is not specified, then one will not be mailed.

REGISTRATION

ONLINE

Register to vote or update your existing voter registration online at **ServiceArizona.com**. You'll need an Arizona Driver License or Identification Card to do so.

HOW TO REGISTER OR UPDATE YOUR VOTER

PRINT

Print a voter registration form from the Arizona Secretary of State's website at azsos.gov

PHONE

To request a voter registration form be mailed to you, call the Recorder's office at **(928) 771-3248 ext. 9**. You must update your voter registration any time you change your home address, name, or political party preference. Election mail is not forwardable.

It's important to keep your mailing address current with our office, even if you are only temporarily away.
